September already! The year is going by too quickly! But anyway, we hope you're enjoying every minute of it and having many fun filled days out with your wonderful dogs.

Regardless of the time of year many of us love to spoil our dogs. Quite right to, after all they are another member of our family. But one area where we must not treat them the same as our human family is in what we feed them.

Not all human foods can be given to dogs because worryingly, some human foods are poisonous to dogs.

One such food is chocolate. Chocolate can cause severe health issues and even death to our beloved dogs because it contains theobromine, which is a toxic poison to canines. While many people know not to let their dogs eat chocolate, reports of chocolate poisoning continue to increase. The real trouble is that dogs love the taste of chocolate but really shouldn't have any at all, as it's too dangerous.

The absolute worst type of chocolate for a dog is baking chocolate, such as the semi-sweet morsels we use for chocolate chip cookies, because it has the highest concentration of theobromine. The least harmful is white chocolate and all other types fall somewhere in the middle regarding toxicity. There is no standard amount of chocolate that's okay for a dog to eat, as his ability to handle this toxin is dependent on his size, overall health and the type of chocolate.

If you find that your little friend has dug into your chocolate cake, please be on the lookout for symptoms of poisoning! As the toxins begin to spread through the body, you may notice that she's become hyperactive or that she's panting a lot. In more severe cases, there will be vomiting or diarrhea. Regardless of the symptoms you see, it's important that you contact veterinary help as soon as possible.

If your dog has already developed a taste for chocolate, you can purchase dog treats that contain carob. Carob tastes a lot like chocolate – you might enjoy it, too – but it does not contain theobromine. Just be on the lookout for specialty dog treats and you're likely to find some carob chip cookies, which many dogs love immensely.

It really is a shame that our best friends can't enjoy all of the same treats that we do, but they do forgive us for refusing to share our cookies (so long as they get their own)!

The Correct Way to Brush Your Dog!

You've probably heard us talk quite a bit about the importance of keeping your dog brushed regularly. It stimulates their skin, removes excess hair and helps to prevent tangles and matting. Whether your dogs have short or long hair, they really do benefit from having a full-body brushing whenever possible.

But while it's important to brush your dog regularly it's even more important to brush your dog thoroughly using the right brush. A quick run with any old brush over your dog's back and sides will not be enough.

For longhaired dogs or for fur that easily tangles, it's ideal to brush them daily; however, shorthaired dogs will still benefit from a weekly brushing.

But what type of brush should you use, and what exactly does a thorough brushing include? The type of brush you should use depends on the length and thickness of fur, as well as susceptibility to tangles.

If your dog's fur is medium to long in length or tends to mat, it's often best to use a slicker brush. These brushes usually have a square or rectangular head of thin wire bristles and they're available in all sizes. For shorthaired dogs, consider using a rubber currycomb. When used in light circles, these feel great on a dog's skin and help you remove excess, dead fur. For curly and thick-coated dogs, you can use a wire-pin brush but it's recommended that you also use a rake if your dog has a thick undercoat.

Of course, brushing should be an enjoyable experience for our dog, which is why it's important that we be gentle. This can be difficult when the fur mats or tangles, so think of it as a tangle in your own hair. By holding onto the tangled portion of fur with one hand placed close against the skin and brushing with the other, you can prevent the painful pull to their skin as you would on your own head.

When brushing your dog, you can begin by brushing from the back of the head to the base of the tail. Then brush the chest and sides by going with the grain from top to bottom. If your dog has a very thick undercoat, you can also brush against the grain to remove some excess fur.

Then comes the tricky part! Many dogs end up with mats on their stomachs, in their armpits and on the backs of their hind legs. For large dogs, encourage them to lay down so that you can thoroughly brush out their stomachs. For small dogs, you can hold their front paws with one hand to help them stand on their hind legs while you brush their bellies with your free hand. But try, too, to get under that tail if they'll let you!

Frequent brushing provides a nice bonding time between you and your dog, but it also saves you both from a lot of hassle that comes from mats and tangles.

Choosing the Best Doggie Bed!

Many of us don't mind at all when our dogs sleep right in our own beds with us; that is, of course, until they start stealing our pillows and blankets or taking up more space than we do! But if we insist that they sleep elsewhere a doggie bed is needed.

There is an unbelievable selection of dog beds on the market, from simple and low cost to extravagant and expensive. But choosing the right bed is more than a matter of taste; it really all depends your dog's needs.

When shopping for a bed, it's important to consider the dog's size, how they lay when sleeping, whether they have health issues and the temperature of the area.

For smaller dogs that like to curl up in a ball to sleep, it's usually best to get a circular or donut-shaped bed that has a nice cushion. You can get a plastic one with a liner or one that is cloth and filled with stuffing. Larger dogs or dogs that like to stretch out will enjoy a larger mat-style bed or a lounge.

When it's hotter or for use outdoors, it's often best to get an elevated plastic bed, as this allows for air circulation and keeps them above any wet ground.

You'll find that there are a few different bed filler options, such as foam or stuffing. When testing the beds, look for something that is dense enough to hold your dog's weight but soft enough to provide some comfort. This is especially important if your dog has hip problems or any type of health or age-related soreness.

Last but not least, it's better to opt for something with a removable and washable cover. This is great for times that our dogs get into messes, shed a lot of fur or bring fleas home! Plus, with all of the gorgeous cloth designs, it's nice to keep them looking great in our homes.

But what's most important is that our dogs have a comfortable place to rest their little heads for a snooze.

Pet Dandruff!

Just like humans, pets get dandruff too. It tends to be seen more in the shorthaired pets but all types get it.

Dandruff is usually just the aging dead skin cells scaling and flaking off. While it's normally harmless, in some cases it can indicate an underlying health issue in your pet, such as an infection, allergy or parasites.

So if your pet starts to show signs of dandruff, do not just assume it's a minor skin condition. Do a little investigation and maybe see your vet to make sure there are no bigger issues causing the problem.
